(\*)** Jon Ossoff and David Perdue advanced to a runoff senate election in this state in 2020. For 10 points, name this state whose capital is Atlanta.

ANSWER: Georgia <Bowman>

2. **In plants, this process results in the development of a cell plate during cytokinesis. Spindle fibers attach to kinetochores on (\*)** chromosomes to pull them to the center of the cell in a part of this process called metaphase. For 10 points, name this process by which a cell replicates into two identical daughter cells.

The Buendias (bwen-DEE-ahs) appear in, for 10 points, what author’s *One Hundred Years of Solitude*?**
